

#### **Chairman's Letter**

#### Dear neighbours

We are entering what promises to be possibly the most important time in Croydon's planning history. Investors are lined up with billions of pounds that they want to spend in our Borough. We can only hope that Croydon Council does not let this opportunity slip through its fingers. The Council has been very slow in keeping residents up to date about when their new headquarters will be coming online. The redevelopment of Lion House (the old Nestle building), the refurbishment of Fairfield Halls (presently underway) and the walkway bridge being built at East Croydon Station are just some of the development plans that are coming to fruition. Most residents seem happy with the refurbishment that has taken place on Lower Addiscombe Road, making the high street environment much more attractive. The replacement of the street lighting in the neighbourhood is going on apace.

The illegal occupation of green spaces in our area by travellers' groups continues to be a problem as does clearing up the mess after they leave. An application under the Freedom of Information Act was submitted to Croydon Council to pin down the exact costs of maintaining Addiscombe Recreation Ground. Although users of the Ground have commented favourably on the redeveloped children's play area, the general level of maintenance and care is very disappointing.

Lee and I have been involved with the ASPRA for the last 11 years. This will be the final year for both of us as Chairman and Secretary and we will be passing the reins on to others at the Annual General Meeting in 2013.

Our biggest single aim when we joined the Committee was to widen the base of community involvement with the Association. Notwithstanding the extraordinary amount of work put in by a very few people, we have conspicuously failed in this area. My constant pleas for more involvement for the most part seems to have fallen on deaf ears and that has been a matter of regret for me. I operated on the mistaken belief that having chosen to live here, more people would also choose to become involved. It is membership renewal time. The Association needs more than your  $\pounds_3$  - it needs your time and participation.



#### LIFESAVERS COME TO ADDISCOMBE New scheme calls for volunteers to learn emergency skills by Ian Flanders

Life threatening emergencies happen every day, but thanks to today's launch of a local scheme, you will have the chance to learn vital skills which could help save someone's life. The scheme, **Heartstart Addiscombe** is urgently calling on volunteers to learn emergency life support (ELS) skills. ELS is the set of actions needed to help keep someone alive until professional help arrives. It includes performing CPR (chest compressions and rescue breathing), dealing with choking, serious bleeding and how to recognise the signs and symptoms of a heart attack. A heart attack is when part of the heart muscle is damaged due to sudden loss of blood supply because of a blocked coronary artery.

Heartstart is a British Heart Foundation (BHF) initiative which teaches members of the public what to do in a life threatening situation. ELS skills are easy to learn and can save lives. The BHF is keen to emphasise the importance of as many people as possible learning these skills:

- Every year around 124,000 people in the UK suffer a heart attack.
- Many of them suffer a cardiac arrest and die before reaching hospital.
- Without resuscitation, cardiac arrest is always fatal.
- Performing CPR could double the person's chance of survival.

A BHF spokesperson said: "It's vital that we all know what to do to keep someone alive in an emergency. A bystander, often a relative or friend, with no medical expertise is likely to be the first person on the scene. Learning the simple skills that save lives through Heartstart can make all the difference."

Free Emergency Life Support training is starting on a monthly basis at St Mildred's Community Centre; the first course was held in August.. To find out more about Heartstart in Addiscombe and where to take a course, please contact:

It was 12 years ago that I first saw a badger in Addiscombe. At that time Tramlink was under construction and I thought it might have been displaced by the building work. I wasn't surprised when I didn't see it again. It was just a couple of months ago that I spotted this badger at the bottom of my garden. A motion triggered infrared camera showed that it is a fairly common visitor during the hours of darkness. Now encouraged by a handful of peanuts each night it visits two to three times a week.



Finally, though not an animal, I include an extreme close up of a Rust Gall growing on the leaf of a pear tree. This fungus causes brown spots which, when looked at closely, shows a fantastic web of fine filaments. The gall is only a few millimetres in diameter.

#### RARE ANIMALS By Graham Cluer

Although none of these animals are particularly rare and wouldn't provoke comment if seen in our leafier suburbs of Coulsdon or Kenley, I do think it worthy of note that they were all photographed in my back garden in Addiscombe within the past year.



Love them for their colour or hate them for the damage they do, the Ring Necked Parakeet is a now common sight in West and South London. The Internet is buzzing with speculation of how they came to become established but they certainly cause raised eyebrows from people who aren't used to seeing them.



The Pheasant is more unusual. Maybe this was meant to be someone's Christmas lunch and it made a break for its freedom? Surprisingly I saw this female a number of times over a 2 week period in December.



The colourful Great Spotted Woodpecker is worth a second look if glimpsed in the countryside. Here it feeds on grubs in an old apple tree in Bingham Road.



I don't often see Jays in the garden. This youngster visited with an adult bird and spent some time soaking up the sun in late spring.

#### The New Mayor of Croydon By Eddy Arram



It was a great honour to be elected as Mayor. Croydon has the most voluntary groups in any London Borough and a lot of great work is undertaken by mostly small groups of people, without any financial support. I was inaugurated as Mayor on 21st May, which included being given the keys to the Mayors toilet, which is grand enough to make the Town Hall a listed building.! The ceremony was punctuated by the heckling of my 2 year old granddaughter who burst into tears as I got up to give my inaugural speech. at which he chamber gave her rapturous applause for interrupting me!

Within a week of being in post it was the Jubilee weekend and out of 140 street parties in Croydon, we visited 30 and lit a beacon in Queens Gardens. Judith, my Mayor's, and I have attended birthday parties for residents reaching 100 years of age, including 2 aged 101. We have visited old people's homes, schools, colleges and charity AGMs. I have opened appeals for blood donors, heart defibrillators, safer cycling and diabetes awareness. I have given 2 UNESCO awards, one of which was based at Croydon University Hospital. We attended the Founders Day Parade of the Nautical Training Corps in Brighton; Croydon was represented by 2 contingents. One of the most moving events was the launching of Armed Forces week. Croydon was the first London Borough to sign up to the Military Covenant. After raising the flag outside Tavernier House, I met some old soldiers and listened to their stories. I presented Civic awards to groups and individuals who have done something for the community during the year and I also have presided over citizen ceremonies, which is given to people from abroad after a period of study who want to become British Citizens; these ceremonies can be quite moving.

Being Mayor means that we are invited to a number of events outside the Borough. We recently attended a ball hosted by the 10<sup>th</sup> TA Paras who have a unit in Croydon, which was held at Sandhurst. Getting there was no problem, but once inside getting to our venue was a little difficult. We were not the only ones experiencing this and soon we had a convoy of other cars following us, who believed that as the car had the crest and pennant, we should know where we were going. Little did they know that we were lost too! Other events we have been to were the Hong Kong Dragon Boat races at Albert Dock and a reception for the Logistics Corp at Regents Park Barracks.

#### **FOSTER CARE** Laura Fitzsimmons

Every 22 minutes a child in the UK comes into care and needs a foster carer. Foster Care Fortnight is a nationwide campaign, co-ordinated by the Fostering Network, to raise the profile of fostering and the amazing work that foster families do. This year the campaign attracted huge celebrity support from Gareth Gates, Lorraine Pascale, Samantha Morton, Fern Britton, Gabby Logan, Jacqueline Wilson and Tim Rhys-Evans.

Croydon Council is encouraging more people in the local community to consider becoming a foster carer. There is a great need for new foster carers every year. As part of the national foster care fortnight campaign to encourage more people to consider fostering, Croydon Council foster carer Debbie Seddon was interviewed by ITV Daybreak, with Vicki Swain from the Fostering Network. Debbie has fostered many teenagers over her 10 years as an approved foster carer for Croydon Council and finds the experience of looking after teenagers challenging, yet emotionally rewarding.

Debbie said: "Fostering is very rewarding; it's not easy and it comes with some difficulties. It gives so much satisfaction when a young person's life is turned around. I have a large extended family now. It can be difficult, each child is an individual but it's about taking small steps, to listen, communicate, not to judge and gradually move forward on a journey, to make them more positive. When I started fostering I wondered if I would be up to the challenge, but the Council gave me all the training, support and guidance I needed. The reward when a young person comes back is phenomenal. You realise you have made that difference."


