50th Anniversary of the Lanfranc Boys' Disaster

On 9th August 1961, a school trip from Lanfranc Boys' School to Stavanger in Norway ended in tragedy when their Viking plane crashed into Holtaheia mountain as they were approaching their destination. There were no survivors. Thirty four boys (most aged 14 years), two teachers and three aircrew were killed.

The news stunned the whole Borough. There were over 700 mourners at the funeral and 1,750 wreaths lined the paths of the cemetery. By 25th August 1961, 100,000 people had visited the grave.

To mark this 50th anniversary there will be a service at the Memorial in Thornton Road Cemetery on Tuesday 9th August and on Sunday 14th August there will be a Civic Service in the Parish Church, followed by a reception hosted by the Mayor for the families and close friends.

Rosalind Jones, a sister of one of the boys, has written a book called 'The Lanfranc Boys' which will be launched with a book signing at Waterstones's bookshop in the Whitgift Centre, Croydon on Wednesday 29th June, between 11am and 3.00pm. Any profits will go to the Red Cross which brought the bodies down from the mountain.

Spicy Grilled Mackerel with Spring Onion Potato and Salad

Ingredients

4 large mackerel

4 tablespoons flour

2 teaspoons hot paprika

4 chopped spring onions potatoes salad

Method

- 1. First prepare a salad of your choice.
- 2. Peel and cook the potatoes.
- 3. While the potatoes are cooking, add a teaspoon of paprika and some salt and pepper to the flour. Lay the mackerel fillets in the flour mixture so they are coated on each side.
- 4. Lay the floured fillets on a baking tray and grill for about 3 minutes on each side under a hot grill until they are golden in colour. (The oils in the fish will make the coating a tasty crust.)
- 5. Mash the potatoes and mix in the spring onions.
- 6. Serve!

This meal will serve four hungry people. Enjoy!

In 1956, the couple were finally given permission to leave London and return to Botswana. Current President Ian Khama, now 58, remembers: "I think I was about three and a half, years old when I left the country. The one thing that always stands out clearly is the party that was given for my farewell party by the nursery school that I attended at the time and I think they made a cake in the shape of an aeroplane because I was going to be flying over."

Exile had given Khama far more political celebrity than he had had before. Back home, Khama set up the Bechuanaland Democratic Party and campaigned for independence. He became the first President of the Republic of Botswana in 1966, saying, "We stand virtually alone in our belief that a non-racial society can work now". Under their first democratic government, Botswana became the fastest developing economy in the world and newly discovered diamond deposits paid for a new social infrastructure. Khama also upheld democracy in a corrupt region, damaged by civil war.

Despite his family's experience, President Ian Khama, who is half-British by blood, said that his father didn't want him and his brothers and sisters to grow up "bearing any grudges at what had happened" in Britain and that he had never heard his father "express any kind of bitterness". This forgiving and far seeing attitude clearly helped Seretse to guide Botswana to a more prosperous and happy time, to be re-elected twice before his premature death in 1980. Lady Ruth Khama became President of the Botswanan Red Cross and continued to work for charity until her death in 2002. Their friend, Julius Nyerere, the late president of Tanzania, said "The romance of Seretse and Ruth was one of the great love stories of the world."

African President Exiled to Addiscombe for Love





If you have read or watched Alexander McCall's 'Lady Detective 'series, set in Botswana, you may remember Mma Ramotswe's adoration of Seretse Khama, the first President of Botswana. You probably don't know that Khama, a hugely important figure for African democracy, used to live in Addiscombe, banished from his homeland due to the woman he loved. His eldest son Ian, who is the current President of Botswana, also spent his early childhood here.

Seretse Khama (1921-1980) was born to be Kgosi (chief) of the Bama-Ngwato tribe in Botswana, in southern Africa, which was then known as Bechuanaland, a British Protectorate. He studied Law at Balliol College, Oxford, in 1945 and then The Inner Temple, London. However, despite this English education, his position changed when he married Ruth William, a young English woman, in 1948. They were forced to marry in a civil ceremony at Kensington registry office, as no church would accept them. Ruth experienced abuse from strangers on the streets of London and Oxford. The British government, were worried that the marriage would disrupt trading with South Africa, who had banned all inter-racial marriages under the system of apartheid and could even lead to South Africa invading Bechuanaland. He and his wife also faced fierce opposition from his tribe.

Despite an investigation which declared Khama "eminently fit to rule", he was exiled to England in 1950. He moved to Croydon and lived in Mapledale Avenue with Ruth and his eldest son, Ian, who is the current President of Botswana. Although inter-racial marriages were extremely uncommon, especially in such a suburban area, it is reported that the couple didn't experience any obvious problems. David Davis, a reporter for 'the Croydon Times', remembers being invited round for cups of tea.







After a (one off) terrible journey with bad service, my friend, a west country native, decided that the driver didn't need his gratitude and yet sure enough, as he left the bus, a respectful "thank you" passed his lips. "I couldn't do it." He said miserably, "but I tried to say it less politely."



Cornwall vs. Croydon

As a lifelong resident of Croydon, and a hardened city dweller, I found the move to the small Cornish town of Falmouth for university, a shock to the system. These are a few differences, good and bad, that I've noticed in my time here.

- 1. They walk so slowly. The laid back pace of life here means that rather than rushing about their business to the extent that they knock each other down, the Cornish like to amble and saunter. This makes the atmosphere very pleasant, but it does mean that standing in Falmouth High Street is akin to watching a replay of 'Dawn of the Dead'.
- 2. Never try to go anywhere on a Sunday. Public transport? Forget it. Just don't put yourself through the strain.
- 3. There are only three, small nightclubs. This may not seem important if you have absolutely no interest in going clubbing, or are over the age of thirty. But this is a town of 5000 students, with only one tacky club, one tiny basement and something that looks like it came out of Benidorm in the 1970s, complete with purple, patterned carpet and the smell of the 1000 beers that have been spilled on it.
- 4. On the other hand, if you ever come down here on holiday, try out the pubs. There are enough to satisfy even the most hardened ale drinker. Traditional pubs, student dives, cocktail bars, boating inns, a bar especially devoted to rum... the list goes on.
- 5. It's true what they say, you do seem to be able to trust the folk down here more. After a lifetime following the three simple rules: no belongings on show, no dawdling and no eye contact, it's an unusual feeling to know that I could stand in the middle of the High Street, with my wallet around in one hand, my i-phone flashing in the other and shout "I've got £50!", without needing to be too worried. Of course, even in Cornwall I wouldn't try this in many other places and of course, being a Croydoner, I still trust nobody.
