#### Interview with Andrew Pelling, MP Independent



Andrew Pelling, the MP for Central Croydon, has certainly courted controversy during his time in office. He began his term in 2005 as a Conservative and is now a fervent independent, known as "Mr Croydon" because of his concern for his constituents, instead of party issues. I meet the man behind the headlines to discuss his time in office, what Croydon needs, and being nicknamed the "smiling assassin". The setting is the Town Hall, centre of council debates. Mr Pelling is polite and welcoming, apologising profusely for running a little behind schedule with his surgery and ready to answer

Andrew Pelling is clearly a man who knows Croydon well. "It brings me a great deal of pleasure to represent my home town". Some MPs have never lived in their constituencies but Andrew grew up here and attended Trinity School before scooting off to New College, Oxford, alongside political contemporaries including William Hague. He feels that he can serve Croydon's needs better as an independent than as part of a party machine because " I am not trapped (*by party policy*) so I can do what will be good for people." His favourite aspect of the job is meeting his constituents and "being invited round for tea."

He obviously enjoys the nitty gritty of "delivering practical change" for Croydon. He is pleased at having recently had large potholes littering the roads of New Addington fixed. "It is most satisfying dealing with my constituents concerns". However, he does not provide a similar example of such work in Addiscombe.

I explain that one of the issues which most worries Addiscombe residents is planning. Residents are outraged that they have very little control over whether a block of flats is built next door to them in an already overcrowded area. Andrew agrees that the planning system should be "radically changed".

He is angry that central Croydon is required to provide 10,000 extra housing units (the population size of Redhill). "The stresses and strains will be very severe", and believes that such over development should be moved out of South East London.

However, Andrew is interested in developing the town centre to improve it's facilities. He introduces the idea of a new Mayday Hospital on the Gateway site at East Croydon as a mark of "achievement", the total opposite of alleged plans to down grade Mayday's status and remove the A and E. At first, I am unsure of the point of this suggestion, but after consideration this does seem a more accessible and spacious location than the present site at West Croydon.

Safety is another issue about which Andrew is very vocal. He understands that many passengers don't feel particularly safe on public transport and suggests a Washington DC style shake up to introduce casually dressed support officerswhen people "see lots of police, they expect trouble". He campaigned for the 'passenger safety officers' who have recently appeared on the trams.

Unsurprisingly, Andrew makes clear his unhappiness at the recent Government move that sends all the asylum seekers in the country to Lunar House. "It is very unfair that the government has not listened!" and calls it "leaving space for the BNP". Two of the constituents that he has met tonight came to complain that they are unable find jobs, blaming the large population of new immigrants.

I asked Andrew if it is a disadvantage for him to be an independent MP, working with a council that is led by Conservative Councillors. He emphatically disagrees: "I have a good relationship with the council officers"- he has known many of them for years- and that this is what counts. He believes that being independent gives him the opportunity to be "more objective" because he does not have to act cautiously to stay within party lines.

It has been a real privilege" to be part of the house of Commons, he says but does comment on the "clubbish atmosphere"- hardly a surprise to voters of our Johnson/Cameron era. He also dislikes the "Yah! Boo!" style of politics, and what he calls the "You're rubbish! But you were rubbish twelve years ago!" approach. He believes that "politely asking questions is a far more constructive approach. Interestingly he says that this catches other MPs off their guard. "I don't know if I should say this..." he says with a grin, telling me how this attitude led a Labour colleague to dub him the "smiling assassin".

parents!" Only 37% of people aged 18-24 are estimated to have voted in the last election, lowest number of any age group. Young people need to vote because they will be affected by current issues to a greater extent, as they will be living with the results for longer, and of course, and paying for them with their taxes.

Gavin has been a councillor for the last twelve years, since the age of twenty six. He grew up in Croydon and is another Trinity School alumni. He says he has "always been interested in politics" and cites his parents as an inspiration. "My mum and dad always said if I wasn't happy, then do something about it." He is currently Head of Governors at Trinity School; "it's nice to give something back."

I explain that residents in our area have been forced to fight against the planning permission for large developments which would overcrowd Addiscombe. "One of the best policies that David Cameron has is the new 'Open Source Planning System'", which will "turn the planning system on its head". Whereas the system is currently top-down, based in Bristol and biased in favour of big business, in these plans, local neighbourhoods would be given more control, with a bottom up approach. There would be the opportunity for residents to suggest positive ideas for their area and the local community could also receive cash incentives to benefit from new developments. He also mentions the idea of more housing in Central Croydon, to take the strain away from the borough's more suburban areas, such as Addiscombe.

Gavin is also extremely concerned by the fact that Lunar House is the only place in the UK where asylum seekers go to claim asylum. "It is wrong that one area deals with a national issue." He will work hard to convince the Government that other areas need to take responsibility for this burden, or that the centre should be moved altogether. Failing this, he will "endeavour to ensure that other areas take a share of the cost".

The only question which throws him (maybe understandably) is on a lighter note: 'Which superhero would you be and why?' "I'd be... Mr Incredible from the Disney film 'The Incredibles'- not because I'm incredible, but because I have a family of Incredibles around me." He moves this along: "Family life is really important to me. My wife and boys give me perspective and first hand experience" of local issues and services, "for example, schools and healthcare". He is vocally in favour of the traditional family and believes "we shouldn't moralise, but undeniably, children born to married couples are healthier, have a more successful childhood and are less likely to commit crime."

Gerry is proud of the work that Labour has done for older residents. "My government has done a tremendous amount" for "the older members of society." "It is vital that we keep marching forward until all pensioners are lifted out of poverty." He assures me that the Freedom Pass is protected "every senior citizen deserves one. I ask Gerry what he can do for middle income families, who feel that they can be overlooked by Labour and taken for granted by the Conservatives. His answer is to "raise educational standards to prepare children for the world of work" by sending more young people to university, to ensure that "their aspirations are met". However, he does not mention any practical or economic improvements for middle income families in their day to day lives.

In answer to the frustrations that our local residents feel about the planning system, Gerry replies that he does not believe the planning system is unfair, saying that "anyone can put anything through." If there are enough objections, he reminds me, then all cases have the opportunity to be heard by the council planning committee.

He does not foresee any changes to the system. He was "heavily involved in scrapping" the proposed MENTA Towers near East Croydon and is "more than happy" to help residents who are unhappy with what is being built near them.

What would you say, I ask, to people who feel that there have been too many scandals and whitewashes, so that they have lost all trust? Gerry agrees that people feel "jaded" and "let down" but says "there is a new intake for sure... of fresh MPs", who will make a difference. All Labour MPs have signed a five

point pledge, which he believes is "absolutely vital to restore confidence". He will not have a second home (unlike his predecessor, Geraint Davis), will take the train to work and will publish every expense claim made online.



Gerry is a fan of Crystal Palace Football Club. His

favourite player is "Julian Speroni. The last line of defence, a real hero!" He is also passionate about the arts scene in Croydon. He says how much he enjoys going to the Warehouse Theatre and believes that "everybody in Croydon should be a big supporter of the Fairfield Halls." He ensures that some children in his constituency are given free pantomime tickets at Christmas.

#### Interview with Gerry Ryan Labour

I meet Gerry Ryan, Labour Candidate for Croydon Central, at the Town Hall. I'm a little surprised that he suggests we conduct our interview on a sofa in the lobby, but then, we have agreed to meet at short notice. Fortunately, a friendly doorman unlocks the door of neighbouring conference room.

Not a man for small talk, Gerry is keen to get down to business. He has lived in Croydon for most of his life and was born in Streatham. He has been Councillor for Selhurst for 12 years (not the nine which is recorded on his slightly out of date website biography). He is married to Jackie, with two grown up sons, has worked for the post office and currently works for B.T. He obviously enjoys his work and is keen to tell me of the technological changes we have lived through.

Gerry is extremely confident that he will win Croydon Central. In fact, certain. "I'm sure I'm gonna win," he tells me. He is a strong supporter of Gordon Brown, calling him "a steady pair of hands", and is fully expecting Mr. Brown to remain Prime Minister for another four years. "He will give us another term".

Gerry tells me the three key changes that he intends to make in Croydon, if elected. He is determined to champion "young people's issues" because Croydon is London's youngest borough" (in terms of population). He has already obtained money from the Crystal Palace Charitable Trust for schemes for children in the school holidays. He would like to introduce "positive activities, such as sport, music and art" with an "anti-crime message," and visited Croydon Judo Club earlier this week, with David Miliband and Tessa Jowell.

He is also keen to help young people and their families in other ways. "I love the idea of offering free school meals" to school children. "Lots of parents say this is a fantastic pledge...it is a life changing idea." He feels that funds spent on schemes such as this, are better spent than on "swish council offices." It is very difficult to not to look around the smart room that we are sitting in, and wonder whether he includes the Town Hall in this.

Thirdly, he is keen to "build on the tram system". He was extremely disappointed to see the planned expansion of the tram link to Crystal Palace scrapped and is "fighting for that to be reinstated." He is also enthusiastic
